

There's an old scale plan in these pages somewhere. The subject here is the Pitts S-1C "Little Stinker" aerobatic bi-plane, as flown by aviatrix Betty Skelton. After looking this plan over, it appears to conform quite faithfully to the prototype. Many of the older scale model plans were woefully inadequate in their conformity to the actual aircraft. These end up being more of a kind of "stand-way-off" model than an actual miniature of the original. Before we get down on the scale model designers of bygone days, we need to remember that hand drafting a plan was a real labor of love as compared to using a scanner and a vector drawing program on the computer. The full scale Little Stinker currently resides in the Udvar Hazy museum at Dulles airport in Washington D. C. I had the good fortune to see the S-1C after it was restored, but before it was put on public display. The aerobatic machine was in the National Air and Space museum's restoration facility in Silver Hill Maryland way back in 2000, awaiting the construction of the new museum. Erik and I spent a day poking around in the Silver Hill buildings. I don't know if you can even gain access to this place anymore, it was a hassle to get in back then. You had to make arrangements well in advance of your visit. My most vivid memory of the place was seeing irreplaceable, historical aircraft jammed into pole buildings like so much cord wood. This is no overstatement, you had to duck under the nose of a P-61 Black Widow at one point to get through. It was truly awe inspiring. There, up close and personal, were planes you saw in magazines as a kid, seeming larger than life. On the lid of my toolbox I still have a photo taken there. It shows a Fiesler Storch jammed in between a Bachem 249 German rocket powered interceptor and a Heinkel He-162 Salamander or "Volksjager", as the Krauts used to call them. Anyway, there should be scale documentation available for the Pitts. If you happen to be in D. C. go pay it a visit. The plan comes to us from the September 1950 issue of Air Trails.

Also, don't forget to pay a visit to the Library in Sussex this coming Saturday. There will likely be some cool cats and kittens hanging around talking about model airplanes the way they were meant to be. Namely, out on a set of lines flying in a circle. 



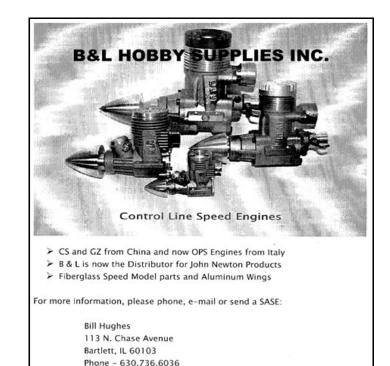
