

Thank you for visiting KidVenture this summer and your interest in our “Eagle One” control line model airplane design. The attached PDF file contains the “Eagle One” plans you requested. These plans are sent free of charge. Please feel free to copy the files to a disc or thumb drive; Kinko’s, Fed X and other print shops are able to print them out as full-sized plans from it.

The planes are made with Coroplast. Coroplast is the material used to make yard signs (it looks like plastic corrugated board). It can be purchased from most sign making companies or from some industrial plastic distributors. In some areas, it is also available at hardware stores like Menards, Home Depot, Lowes and Ace. In some cases you can use discarded signs.

Once you have your model built, you may choose to find an experienced flyer to help you learn to fly it. The Academy of Model Aeronautics website can also be used to locate a chartered club locally that could offer assistance in getting started. Local hobby shops are also a good source for assistance and information in locating local flyers and clubs.
